2013-2014 Idaho Lions Sight and Hearing Foundation Community Impact

- Corneas provided for transplant: 306
- Recycled eyeglasses: 33,592 pairs
- Personal Assistance: 35 sight restoring surgeries provided at a cost of \$39,754
- Hearing Aid Assistance: 22 hearing aids provided at a cost of \$3,046
- Mobile Screening Unit – Individual health screenings: 14,724
- Mobile Screening Unit – Individuals referred for further medical attention: 2,932

The Idaho Lions Sight and Hearing Foundation strives to be a premiere humanitarian service organization, dedicated to serving the Lions of Multiple District 39 in Idaho and Eastern Oregon. Primary services include the Idaho Lions Eye Bank, the Personal Assistance program, the Mobile Screening Unit (MSU), the Lions Hearing Aid Bank and Eyeglass Recycling program. All programs offered by the Foundation are aimed at alleviating suffering in Idaho and Eastern Oregon communities by providing services for financially disadvantaged people, allowing them to return to work, take care of their families, and live a happy and productive life.

The services offered by the Foundation are desperately needed throughout Idaho. In 2011 19.3% of people living in Idaho were uninsured, putting Idaho in the top 15 states with the lowest healthcare coverage, and 15.8% of the population was living under the federal poverty level. Individuals without health insurance are less likely to receive preventative and diagnostic healthcare, are more often diagnosed with medical issues at a later stage, and on average receive less treatment for their conditions than insured individuals. The services provided by the Foundation are offered free of charge and therefore directly contribute to the sustainability of Idaho and Eastern Oregon communities.

Idaho Lions Sight and Hearing Foundation Programs and Services

- **The Idaho Lions Eye Bank** – The Foundation operates one of the leading Eye Banks in the country. The Idaho Lions Eye Bank obtains, medically evaluates and distributes corneal eye tissue from humanitarian individuals who donate their eyes when they pass away. The Eye Bank places tissue for transplant throughout Idaho, the United States and the world. In 2013-2014 the Eye Bank was able to provide 306 corneas for transplant.
- **Personal Assistance** – in 2013-2014 the Idaho Lions Sight and Hearing Foundation Personal Assistance program was able to award over \$42,000 in financial assistance to individuals in need of medical treatment for issues concerning vision and hearing. The Personal Assistance program assists with cataract surgeries, corneal transplants, retinal detachments, glaucoma surgery, and diabetic retinopathy to name a few.
- **Mobile Screening Unit (MSU)** – The Mobile Screening Unit is a state-of-the-art 38-foot trailer pulled by a tractor unit that offers free health screenings for children at elementary schools, the general public at health fairs, retirement homes and businesses. The MSU is outfitted with screening technology to

provide hearing, vision, blood pressure and diabetes screenings. In 2013-2014 the MSU was able to screen over 14,724 people with the help of 613 volunteers over the course of 57 events.

- **Eye Glass Recycling** – The Idaho Lions Sight and Hearing Foundation and the 1,588 Lion members from the 70 clubs in Eastern Oregon, Southwest Idaho and Eastern Idaho help collect, sort and distribute used eyeglasses. The Foundation was able to send 33,592 pairs of glasses to developing nations through the help of humanitarian mission teams who distribute them to those in need.
- **Hearing Aid Assistance and Hearing Aid Bank** – The Idaho Lions Sight and Hearing Foundation financially assists individuals obtain hearing aids. The Foundation works with numerous audiologists and other service agencies around Idaho to ensure the best care possible. In 2013-2014 the Foundation was able to supply 22 people with hearing aids who would not have been able to obtain them without assistance.
- **Diabetes Awareness** – Diabetes is the 6th leading cause of death and affects almost every part of the body. Diabetes costs the U.S. 132 billion dollars annually and the Foundation has therefore taken a proactive approach to spread information about diabetes.
